



### Spotlight on: PTA Mini-grants at JP & Morse



JP and Morse each received money via PTA's mini-grant program to purchase a sensory path to install in a hallway. Using a sensory path is a creative and playful way for kids to develop the ability to complete complex, multi-stage tasks. The sensory paths can also be used to provide a "brain-break" for the children during the school day, which can reduce sensory-seeking behaviors while increasing cognitive function. The next time you're in JP or Morse, be sure to try it yourself!

JP also received funds for Psychologist Anna Ginther to compile "cool-down kits"

for each classroom and funds for each K classroom to adopt an animal from the World Wildlife Fund. In the case of the WWF adoption, the PTA contribution was complemented by monies from the Foundation for the Public Schools of the Tarrytowns for art supplies so classes could build habitats for their animals.
