- HS PTA outreach
 - Mini-grants more equitable than the scholarships last year
- Fundraising committee might be needed in the future to discuss equitable fundraising by the PTA and district
- Review points from monthly Borsari meeting (Sophia/Elissa/Bri)
 - Staff treats on superintendent conference days/staff appreciation lunch on May conference day instead of separate days
 - All buildings have the lunch on the same day, but in separate buildings
 - What would parents do with the kids? Will be difficult to find volunteers to help; child care is an issue.
 - Different days can help to not over burden parents
 - Anti-bullying program (OLVAUS from a state grant for K-12)...(also potential joint funding by PTA/Foundation for a Sept. speaker)
 - District applied to grant
 - Staff trained over the summer and implemented next year
 - Fundraising "shaming" raised at BOE mtg
 - Shaming over prizes from Boosterthon (happened in PE)
 - District is addressing bullying
 - Looking into an outside contractor to help train staff on how to address bullying and microaggressions
 - Biggest problem with bullying in MS
 - District led efforts but cannot take down social media that involves bullying

 - Committee helped to choose superintendent days
 - Easter Monday has been requested off for next year
 - Can there be a day off on other cultural holidays that are now being recognized and represented?
 - Ramadan time off for students who are fasting
 - School should also recognize how fasting impacts students (e.g. in athletic activities, they might be slower and not as focused)
 - Where can a student who is fasting stay during lunch time?
 - Passover 2 days needed
 - Can an equity calendar be created for staff awareness and education?

 - Prioritizing improving accessible communication in schools
 - Brenda and Jean have held 2 tech nights in Spanish
 - Brenda trying to coordinate with Jean a date for another tech night in person at Life Center
 - Brenda spoken with schools' sports administration trying to host sports expo day in spring
 - Community wide event for all families to learn about each sport offered by the district, learn how it's played, what uniform and equipment is needed, and to speak to coaches and players about the sport
 - e.g. Lacrosse exposing more Hispanic kids to the sport
 - Planning to being for Back to School Night en Espanol in September
 - District Equity Team Ana to join on behalf of the PTA DEI Committee

 - 4 members of the DEI committee attended including Brenda and Ana
 - 3 featured speakers including a NY State regent, ending with a presentation by Dr. Alexandria Connelly
 - Creating a culturally responsible and sustaining framework
 - Emphasizing the need to end systemic wide racism
 - Can Dr. Connelly present in our own district?
 - Dr. Connelly, assistant principal in Yonkers who struggled in the educational system
 - Earned 5 graduate degrees and now a traveling inspirational speaker
 - We have a lot to learn from Ossining in our district

- Action Network 8th year celebration in Ossining
 - Ossining district's 4th grade DEI committee representatives speaking
 - Fair for students
 - DEI student group from HS, ENL rep, came together to attend practices and initiatives

 - rep from group stepped down this year
 - 2 new staff members taking charge, still learning process
